## Land Angels

Recently, Habitat Cape Cod was gifted parcels of land from some amazing individuals who graciously donated properties for us to build on in Brewster and in Sandwich.

More than two years ago, Elizabeth Finch approached Habitat suggesting we subdivide her nearly 58,000-square-foot property into three lots. Habitat could build two affordable homes, and she would continue to live in her current home. After securing required approvals from the Town of Brewster and other entities, two thirds of the the land now belongs to Habitat Cape Cod and two homes will be built starting in 2023.

Around that same time, The DeGraw Family, through their real estate agent, Tori Harrison Farr, contacted Habitat Cape Cod about land they owned in Sandwich on Nauset Street and Cotuit Road. We will be raising walls on the three permitted homes in Sandwich this fall.

We are very grateful to these families for their generous support through land donations.

## Vet Build Update

Thanks to the pedal power of Ed Ebert, along with the support of other Friends of Bob Harding, \$70,000 has already been raised to fund the costs of building a home with a Veteran preference on 26 Red Top Road in Brewster. Ed will be riding in our Ride for Homes event on September 11th if you are interested in supporting his efforts!

The permit has been recorded and the donation (thank you Beth Finch!) of land has been closed. If all goes smoothly, we are planning to raise walls on these two 3-bedroom homes on Red Top Road in Brewster in the fall of 2023. The other home is being sponsored through the generosity of Peter Soule.

Arelis says her favorite activity is hammering and she is getting better, the nails don't turn so much anymore. Working side by side with her future neighbors allows her and Alfred a chance to get to know them better.

Anyone affiliated with Habitat, just know you guys really do make a difference!

My advice to anyone applying: don't give up! It may take a few tries, but don't lose hope. Don't be overwhelmed. The process can be intense, but the wait and the outcome are so so worth it!!!!

## "Decon" Team

We've launched a new program! The Deconstruction (Decon) Team is headed up by volunteers Brian Ritchie, Clay Erickson, Keith Magyar and Tom Simeone. Our highly trained and fully insured Decon Team will take down and remove cabinets for homeowners or contractors remodeling kitchens.

Used cabinets are typically thrown away during a remodel, but thanks to Habitat, they can have a second life. The volunteer team will bring them back to one of Habitat's two ReStore locations (Yarmouth or Falmouth) where they will be sold to the public.

Funds raised will be used to build more affordable homes on the Cape.

The uninstall and removal of cabinets is a free service.

They have removed cabinet sets from 14 homes so far and have raised over \$40,000 for Habitat!

## Equitable Access to Green Energy



Are you passionate about clean energy and helping others? If so, please consider sponsoring a home energy package!

**Purpose:** Your donation of \$25,000 will equip one Habitat for Humanity of Cape Cod home with the following elements:

**Solar Panel Array** - Each home is situated on the lot to maximize the benefits of capturing solar energy. We generally install anywhere from 5.4Kw (16 panels) to 7.9 Kw (24 panels) on our homes, depending upon the size of the house. The system is sized to allow the homeowner the potential for achieving Net Zero over the course of any given year. This means with moderate energy consumption our

families may eliminate their utility bills, a milestone for families who typically are unable to access the benefits of solar energy.

**Non-Combustion Air Source Heat Pump** -The most common type of heat pump is the air-source heat pump, which transfers heat between the house and the outside air. High-efficiency heat pumps also dehumidify better than standard central air conditioners, resulting in less energy usage and more cooling comfort in summer months. Air-source heat pumps have been used for many years in nearly all parts of the United States, but until recently they have not been used in areas that experienced extended periods of subfreezing temperatures. However, in recent years, air-source heat pump technology has advanced so that it now offers a legitimate space heating alternative in colder regions.

**ERV Air Exchange System** - ERV stands for energy recovery ventilator, with common name variations including ERV air exchangers and ERV ventilation systems. ERVs draw clean, fresh air into a home and remove stale air simultaneously. The incoming fresh air is pre-conditioned by the outgoing conditioned stale air. Along with this transfer of air streams, ERV ventilation systems capture contaminants, pollutants, allergens, pollen, and more, helping to ensure that the air that enters and is kept within the home is clean and healthy.

**EV READY** - Beginning in Falmouth 2022 – we will be making our homes Electric Vehicle Charging ready. We plan to install a conduit from the panel (with a dedicated 240v, 40 amp circuit) to a termination at an exterior outlet box suitable for installation of a future charging station. While EV's are currently not within easy reach of moderate income families, this will provide one less hurdle when considering a future purchase.

## Donating Solar Credits

Did you know you can donate your excess solar net metering electric credits to Habitat Cape Cod?

We have recently received several donations of credits which are helping to offset our office and ReStore electric expenses. We are very grateful for these donations!

Twice a year, Eversource allows homeowners to update their Schedule Z form by which you may allocate credits to any public, private or nonprofit entity. The credits may be apportioned at 100% or less.

As these credits never expire and roll over month to month, some individuals, particularly “snow birds” who leave the Cape in winter, are finding they are accumulating credits they never use.

Such credits can be put to good use here at Habitat!

## Donating Land

Simply – in order to build houses – we need to secure land to build on!

Our successful model has always relied on land “donations,” in one form or another. Generally, there are three ways that we secure land: 1) through municipal land award following a successful response to a Town's RFP for Affordable Housing Development; 2) through land purchase using Community Preservation Act or a Town's Housing Trust funds; 3) through land donations.

Do you know of a parcel of land that is town owned? Do you want to explore donating land you own (or a portion)? Perhaps you have an existing home that you would like to donate now or bequeath to Habitat for future use.

Are you a real estate agent with a client who has an “unusable” parcel of land? We are very interested in talking with you about how we might use your land to create much needed affordable homeownership here on the Cape. Let's explore the many potential benefits – together!

## Volunteer Spotlight continued

Christina has her own consulting practice and her skill set allows for her to fill diverse volunteer needs. She enjoys engaging with prospective families on the Interview Committee, and is a Family Partner to her fifth Cape family and she has been known to lift a hammer when needed. Christina also co-led a Cape group to an international build in the Dominican Republic in 2017.

In 2007, the Brodies and their son Ethan, joined a Habitat Cape Cod team on a Blitz Build in Jackson, Mississippi. Eight teams built eight homes for New Orleans residents who had lost their homes in the Hurricane Katrina disaster. "It was an inspiring experience to build a home from scratch in just a week with our Habitat Cape Cod team," Christina recalled.

After moving to Falmouth in 2015, Christina (still working part-time) and Warren (working full-time) were looking for ways to contribute more to their new community and meet people.

Christina, influenced by her parents who always demonstrated a willingness to build community wherever they were, was especially interested in partnering with women as they claim their power. In addition to Habitat, she volunteers with We Can.

"I was thrilled to find so many women as Habitat homeowners," she says, continually ready to find the next way to be supportive.

Warren has provided legal counsel for Habitat builds across the Cape. It would be hard to list his contributions over the years. Warren remembers Habitat former board president and visionary leader, Don Dickenson, who chaired the Land Acquisition Committee and who recruited Warren for the Habitat Board.

"Habitat was building one to two houses per year on the Cape. Don wanted to do much more and ultimately proved that we could build ten to twelve homes per year, if not more. For several years Don and I traveled around the Cape, talking to Habitat supporters and local government folks and exploring potential building sites. It is crucial to bring the community into the process and to foster local coalitions. Applications are submitted to Zoning and Planning boards and reviewed by many government departments and agencies. It can take months and even years to get a project approved. I have been working on one project in Wellfleet for over 15 years."

Because the Brodies embody the essence of collaborating with others, it's obvious how much they receive in return. Warren has nothing but admiration for Habitat Cape Cod. "We get things done. It's a vibrant organization that functions at a high professional level from the Board members to the ReStore and office staff to the construction leaders and core volunteers. We've built 160 plus houses here, but we still have a crisis we're not solving fast enough."

"Habitat homes are about empowerment," adds Christina. "When you own your home, you're really in charge of your own life. People can find so many ways to be involved. In addition to the roles described here, you can Ride for Homes and Fish for Homes. You can contribute snacks for construction site work breaks."

For more fun, she has also helped out at the Falmouth ReStore, which has special benefits. "Got a great leaf blower for ten bucks!" she smiles.
